## NEW BOOK OFFERINGS FOR YOUR SUMMER READING




Gen. Wade Hampton

*Wade Hampton*, by Rod Andrew, Jr., University of North Carolina. Wade Hampton (1818-1902) led soldiers at Trevilian Station in Virginia and at Gettysburg. His wartime experiences

are well-known but the General also built an influential postbellum career, first serving as one of the first postwar governors of South Carolina and later as a U. S. Senator.

Among the last of South Carolina's elite to give up an opposition to secession, Hampton was a bold, competent commanding officer who at the conclusion of the war found himself bankrupt with most of his property in ruins. This book chronicles his wartime experiences, his postwar experiences, and, most importantly, the personal struggles and private pain endured by this husband, father, brother, and Southern patriot.

Also available for your reading pleasure this summer is *The Papers of Jefferson Davis, Vol. 12,* edited by our own Lynda Lasswell Crist and staff. This volume chronicles Davis through his years as a federal prisoner at Fort Monroe to Canada, Europe, and then Memphis as he and his family struggle during the harsh aftermath of the war.


Another interesting new book on Jefferson Davis this summer is *Pursuit: the Chase, Capture, Persecution, & Surprising Release of Confederate President Jefferson Davis* by Clint Johnson. The author is of the opinion that President Lincoln did not want to imprison Davis. His premise is that Lincoln, his successor Andrew Johnson, and their cabinets feared that putting Davis on trial for treason would afford him the opportunity to prove before the U. S. Supreme Court that secession was and is—constitutional. Other largely unknown and still controversial positions relative to his subject are further detailed in the narrative. And for those of you who are planning a vacation this summer and who are looking for a few new side trips from your usual routes, the *"Hallowed Ground"* magazine of the Civil War Preservation Trust recommends that you pick up a copy of *Civil War Sites: The Official Guide to the Civil War Discovery Trail* and no matter where you're going, you'll be able to find Civil War history somewhere along the way!

Published by Globe Pequot Press, the publication contains indispensable information for the historic traveler. From operating hours and entrance fees to driving directions, you'll find everything you need for a successful visit to 610 sites in 31 states, the District of Columbia, and three foreign countries!



And one more suggestion: *The Winds of Change*, an historical novel about the last fourteen months of the war by Richard L.Guida, has been reviewed as written "in the tradition of *Killer Angels.*"

Oh, Yes! For those of you who enjoyed Daniel McCaig's fictional *Jacob's Ladder*, the author has written a new novel entitled *Canaan: A Novel of the Reunited States after the War* that some reviewers consider a better book than its prequel. This new book reprises some of the best-drawn characters from *Jacob's Ladder* and takes the reader on a journey from Virginia to Montana and points east. The plot deals with Reconstruction and Plains Indian conflicts and culminates at Little Big Horn.
