THE HCWRT PRESENTS

The Nau Civil War Collection and Curator Sally Anne Schmidt, Ph.D.

Our speaker for November's meeting at the John L. Nau III Civil War Collection is Dr. Sally Anne Schmidt, who is beginning her fifth year as the collection's curator. She started in 2005 as a curatorial assistant.

Dr. Schmidt attended Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, MD, receiving her undergraduate degree in History in 2000. Moving to Houston, she enrolled at Rice University to further her interest in southern history, receiving her master's in 2003 and her Ph.D. in 2009. Her thesis was titled, Saving Galveston: A History of the Galveston Historical Foundation.

As curator, Dr. Schmidt is responsible for the care, organization, and exhibition of one of the largest collections of Civil War artifacts, documents, and photographs in private hands anywhere. She created and continues updating the collection's

database and object files and conducts research related to items in the collection.

In addition to planning and directing the installation of the Civil War exhibit at Silver Eagle Distributors and John L. Nau, III's home, she evaluates the collection's needs, negotiates with dealers on new items and answers researcher's questions. She also coordinates tours and events for teachers, students, and adults.

The Nau Civil War Collection

The Nau Collection is one of the largest private collections of Civil War artifacts, documents, and photographs in the country.



John Nau's interest in the Civil War began in childhood, and his work as chairman of the Texas Historical Commission in the mid- to late-1990s rekindled his interest. He began collecting in earnest around the year 2000, and by the fall of 2004, the collection had reached such that а size professional curatorial assistance was required.

Sally Anne Schmidt began working on the collection part-time as a graduate student in January 2005, and she has guided the collection's growth, exhibition, and conservation full-time since October 2008.

Selections from the collection are on display at Silver Eagle Distributors and also in Mr. Nau's home. Items are often on loan to museums such at the Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum and the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston. Recently, the Houston Museum of Natural Science exhibited over 200 Nau artifacts in the exhibition, "Discovering the Front Line."



Currently, the Nau Civil War Collection contains over 17,000 documents, letters, and newspapers; approximately 2,500 ambrotype, tintype, and cartede-visite portraits of soldiers; more than 175 pistols, revolvers, carbines, rifles, and muskets; and over 130 swords and sabers. It also contains flags, drums, uniforms, accourrements, and miscellaneous Civil War-related items.

Mr. Nau collects artifacts and documents related to all aspects of the war, Union and Confederate, but some of his more popular pieces are related to Texas. The collection includes both a .44 caliber Army Revolver made by J. H. Dance & Brothers, but also the rare .36 caliber Navy Revolver by Dance.



It also contains one of the eighteen Model 1833 Ames Dragoon Officer's Swords imported in 1840 by the Republic of Texas.



William Amos Wortham carried the Nau Collection's example when he served as an officer in the 32nd Texas Cavalry and later commanded the 35th Texas Cavalry. In addition, Mr. Nau owns one of the last photographic images taken of Sam Houston, a sixth plate daguerreotype portrait of the Texas hero ca. 1861-1863.

John Nau and Dr. Sally Anne Schmidt, Ph.D., welcome the Houston Civil War Round Table to Silver Eagle. Visitors will be able to view the Civil War exhibit cases at Silver Eagle and an additional special display of items usually kept in storage. The executive corridor featuring the Nau Collection of Texas Art will also be open.

Following dinner, Dr. Schmidt will tell us more about some of the Nau Collection's highlights during her illustrated talk.

Julia Ward Howe was inspired to write the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" during a visit to wartime Washington. When the editors of the Atlantic Monthly Graciously agreed to print her song, compensated her the total sum of five dollars (Yankee greenbacks I'm sure).
