
The HCWRT Presents Keith Bohannon Speaking on:

"The Battle of Chickamauga"


The topic of Keith's lecture will be the battle of Chickamauga, the second bloodiest engagement of the Civil War and the only major battlefield victory won by the Confederate Army of Tennessee. The campaign actually began in late June 1863 when Union General Williams S. Rosecrans advanced from the vicinity of Murfreesboro. Tennessee against Confederate Army of Tennessee under General Rosecrans's goal for the Braxton Bragg. campaign was to capture the important rail junction of Chattanooga, Tennessee. what is often referred to as the Tullahoma Campaign, Rosecrans and his Army of the Cumberland flanked Bragg's army out of middle Tennessee, crossed the Tennessee River and captured Chattanooga. After retreating into northwest Georgia, Bragg received considerable

reinforcements, including two divisions under General James Longstreet sent from Virginia. Bragg then developed a battle plan to cross Chickamauga Creek and interpose his troops between the Federal Army and Chattanooga to subsequent the north. The battle Chickamauga occurred over the course of three the decisive phase occurring September 20, 1863. On the morning of the 20th, General Longstreet launched a massive attack that broke through a gap in the center of the Union line that had been created by confusing orders sent from Rosecrans to subordinates. The subsequent rout swept much of the Union Army, including its commander, from the field. While the battle ruined the reputation of Rosecrans, it enhanced the reputation of his subordinate General George H. Thomas who led a gallant defense of an elevated position that became known Snodgrass Hill.

Rosecrans lost more than 16,000 men killed, wounded, and captured at Chickamauga, while Bragg's army sustained more than 18,000 total casualties. While the battle was a Confederate victory, Rosecrans achieved his objective for the campaign, which was the capture of Chattanooga.

Keith Bohannon is a professor of history at the University of West Georgia. He received his master's degree from the University of West Georgia, where he studied under Emory Thomas. He received his PhD from Pennsylvania State University where he worked with Gary Gallagher and Mark Neely. Keith is the author of numerous essays in the University of North Carolina's Military Campaigns of the Civil War Series and co-editor with Randall Allen of A Georgian with Old Stonewall (Louisiana State University Press, 1998). He helped research and write the text for many of the exhibits in the Chickamauga National Military Park Visitor Center and gives frequent tours of the battlefield there. His current research projects include a study of the destruction of Confederate Army records during the Appomattox Campaign, revising his doctoral dissertation for publication, and writing a biography of John Bell Hood. Keith lives in Carrollton, Georgia, with his wife, three children, and an eight-pound dog named Sadie
