TEXAS CITY MUSEUM

If you're looking for a Civil War-themed day excursion in the air conditioning this summer, you might check out the Texas City Museum. Their exhibits highlight the history of Texas City, especially the 1947 explosions that devastated the city, but they have recently opened an exhibit with artifacts from the USS Westfield. The USS Westfield was sunk during the Battle of Galveston in 1863 and approximately 8,000 artifacts have been recovered from the wreck. Large parts of the ship's steam machinery were reconstructed and are on display along with a 9" Dahlgren cannon (pictured below) and many other artifacts.
