2020 VANDIVER AWARD RECIPIENT: BRIAN STEEL WILLS

The Houston Civil War Round Table is honored that the **2020 Frank E. Vandiver Award of Merit will be presented to Brian Steel Wills** at the May 21 meeting. Since 1982, the HCWRT has presented its highly respected Vandiver Award annually in recognition of an individual or an organization making a substantial contribution to the preservation of our Civil War heritage. Past recipients include a "Who's Who" of Civil War notables.

Brian Wills is the Director of the Center for the Study of the Civil War Era and Professor of History at Kennesaw State University in Kennesaw, Ga. Dr. Wills is a member of the Georgia Civil War Commission and current President of the Atlanta Civil War Round Table. He is also the author of numerous works relating to the American Civil War, including biographies of prominent leaders. His latest book, Inglorious Passages: Noncombat Deaths in the American Civil War, received the 2018 Richard Barksdale Harwell Award for the best book on a Civil War topic for the year 2017. This award is presented by the Atlanta Civil War Round Table. Dr. Wills' acceptance talk at our upcoming May 21 meeting will be "Inglorious Passages."

Brian Wills is one of our most popular speakers. He has appeared before our Round Table four (soon to be five) times, and led our 2015 Fall Field Trip of the Atlanta campaign. His talks are always a treat – powerful, interesting, and witty.

The Vandiver Award is named for the late Civil War historian and former President of Texas A&M University, the University of North Texas, and Rice University, who also was one of the earliest members of the HCWRT. The 2020 Vandiver Award Committee consisted of Gene Boisaubin (Chair), Keith Altavilla, Gary Chandler, Jim Godlove, and John Stevens.
