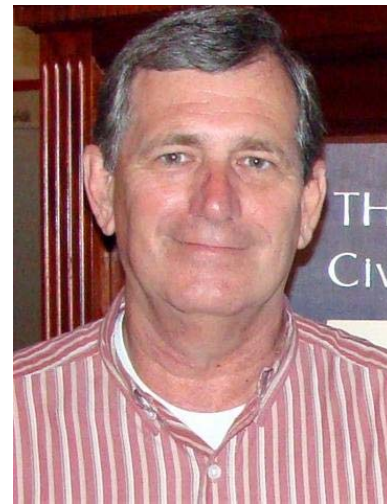

The HCWRT Presents Michael Bailey on the "1864 Battle of Mobile Bay"

On August 5, 1864 the Rear-Admiral David Farragut's West Gulf Blockading fought its way to victory in Mobile Bay. The squadron withstood concentrated fire from Confederate held Fort Morgan, the deadly menace of torpedoes, and a Confederate naval squadron that included the C.S.S. Tennessee, one of the South's most powerful ironclads which was commanded by Admiral Franklin Buchanan, the most experienced flag officer in the Confederate Navy. This battle, which Farragut said was "*the hardest won victory of my life,*" was one of the largest naval actions fought during the Civil War. It produced ninety-six Medal of Honor recipients (the most of any single battle in American military history) and a battle cry which still echoes to this day.

Who were the major characters who played parts in this campaign? What impact did this naval battle and the subsequent capture of Fort Morgan have both militarily and politically on the Civil War? Did David Farragut actually command "Damn the torpedoes, Full Speed Ahead!" If not, who did? I will give an account of the Battle of Mobile Bay and the Siege of Fort Morgan and provide answers to these questions in my presentation.

Michael M. Bailey earned his degree in History from Auburn University at Montgomery and has worked in public history for thirty six years. He is a co-author of *Fort Morgan* and has appeared on History's *Deep Sea Detectives*, the recently completed documentary *The Battle of Mobile Bay*, as well as others that deal with The Battle of Mobile Bay and Fort Morgan. He is Senior Historian and Curator of Fort Morgan State Historic Site in Gulf Shores, Alabama.

The Confederate admiral in command of the naval forces at Mobile Bay had had a distinguished pre-war U.S. Navy career. He was in command of the Washington Navy Yard when he resigned his commission in April, 1861. In addition to being the first superintendent of the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, he had commanded Perry's flagship in the expedition to Japan. As a Confederate, he commanded the CSS Virginia in its first action on March 8, 1862, when he was wounded in the leg.
