
"Hiram Granbury's Texas Brigade at the Battle of Franklin"

On an Indian summer afternoon, November 30, 1864, the once-vaunted Confederate Army of Tennessee stood poised atop the Winstead Hills overlooking Franklin, Tennessee, awaiting the final word to advance. On the pike itself, the famed Texas Brigade known simply as "Granbury's" had its left affixed on the roadbed, its distinctive blue and white Hardee's flags whipping in the breeze. In a gloaming sunset, the "finest brigade in the best division" of John Bell Hood's army would shortly experience a

debacle virtually unique among Rebel troops: Nearly all would be killed, wounded, or captured in the coming attack.

About Dr. Danny Sessums

A native of the Texas Panhandle town of Danny Sessums received Borger. undergraduate degree in anthropology from Texas Tech University. Sessums did graduate work in U.S. history at U.T. Arlington in 1981-84, and during 1983-87 he studied antebellum history at LSU, where he received his Ph.D. postdoctoral Sessums' career museum work with teaching U.S. history at the following: Port Hudson Commemorative Area, 1983-86; Old Fort Museum & Western-Arkansas Community College, 1986-90; and Museum of the Gulf Coast and Assistant Professor, Lamar University – Port Arthur, 1990-98. Subsequently he served as: Associate Professor at Arkansas State University, 1998-2001; Director, George Ranch History Park, Fort Bend County, 2001-2002; and Director, Museum of the Gulf Coast/Houston Baptist University, 2002-2009.

After his retirement from HBU, Sessums and his wife Candace relocated to the Tyler area. Last year, Sessums published volume I of A Force To Be Reckoned With (A History of Granbury's Texas Infantry Brigade 1861-65), a culmination of his research into this illustrious brigade that began with his doctoral dissertation more than 30 years ago. He is currently preparing the concluding volume II for publication. Sessums has also taken an active role in multiple Civil War re-enactments, and was a historical advisor to the director of the Civil War film "Glory."
