All proceeds from the symposium will go to the Jefferson Historical Society and Museum.


HTBAR SCHOLARLY SEMINAR

July 1, 1862 – Battle of Malvern Hill, Virginia

July 5, 1861 – Engagement at Carthage, Missouri

July 7, 1865 – Conspirators in the assassination of Lincoln are executed July 11, 1861 – Engagement at Rich Mountain, Virginia (now West Virginia) July 12, 1862 – John Hunt Morgan's Confederate raiders capture Lebanon, Kentucky on their first raid

July 13, 1862 – Garrison at Murfreesboro, Tennessee captured by Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest

July 14, 1864 – Battle of Tupelo, Mississippi

July 18, 1864 - Battle of Cool Spring, Virginia

July 27, 1861 – Major General George McClellan put in command of the Federal Division of the Potomac

July 28, 1864 - Battle of Ezra Church, Georgia
