# The HCWRT Presents Shae Smith Cox Speaking On:

"The Fabric of Civil War Society"

Historian Shae Smith Cox, author of *The Fabric* of *Civil War Society: Uniforms, Badges, and Flags, 1859-1939*, will discuss how material culture, specifically uniforms, badges, and flags, shaped and reflected American identities and memories during and after the US Civil War.

She will demonstrate how these objects were not only practical tools of warfare, but also how they became symbols of politics, power, and memory for future generations. Dr. Smith Cox's presentation will trace how these items transitioned into cherished objects by the turn of

the century, when veterans began replacing their wartime uniforms with newly designed veteran uniforms. Memory machines were created in the form of memorial and commemorative groups, such as the Grand Army of the Republic, Woman's Relief Corps, United Confederate Veterans, and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. These groups used material objects to battle for control of people's memory from the war and perpetuate the Lost Cause narrative.



#### **About Shae Smith Cox**

Shae Smith Cox is an Assistant Professor of History in the War and Society Program and a core member of the Public History faculty at Texas A&M University in College Station. She earned her Ph.D. in American History at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas with a minor in Public History. She studies 19<sup>th</sup> century race and gender with an emphasis on material culture, senses, emotions, and memory of the U. S. Civil War and Reconstruction.

LSU Press published her first book, *The Fabric of Civil War Society, Uniforms, Badges, and Flags, 1859-1939.* She is now working on her second project, an auditory history of Civil War hospitals, titled *'The Suffering and Groans of the Wounded and Dying Were Terrible to See and Hear': Auditory Experiences of Civil War Suffering.* This book will examine the experiences of Civil War surgeons, nurses, and attendants in hospital settings.

#### October Quiz By Jim Godlove


